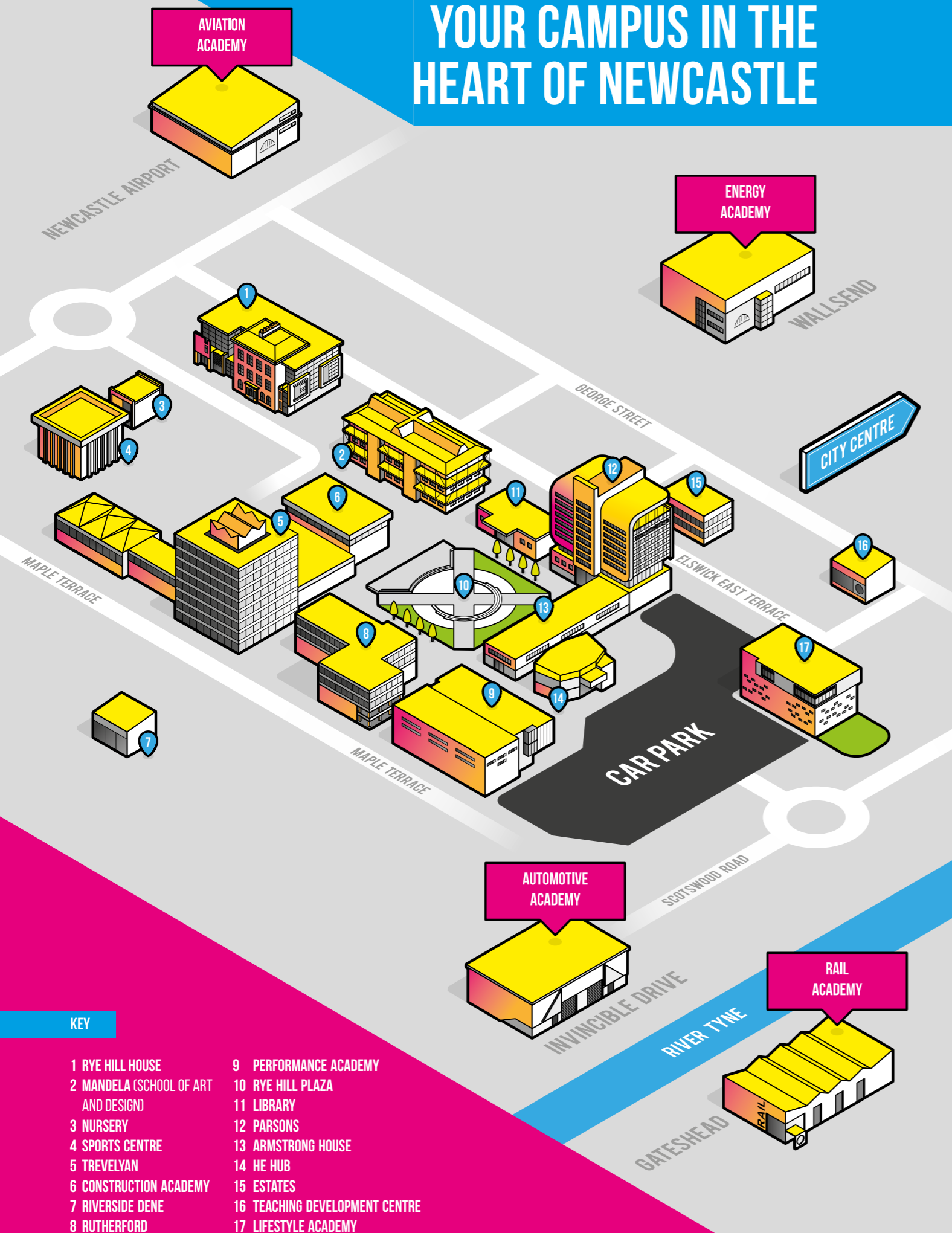

ADULT COURSE OFFER

At Newcastle College we want to give you every opportunity to be able to get a job, retrain, pursue your passion or secure that all important promotion. Here you'll find a range of courses designed to give you the knowledge, skills and qualifications to achieve your ambition.

SUPPORT WITH STUDY COSTS*

If you have a household income of between £25,001 - £32,300, you could receive the following support:

- FREE travel support (if you live 3 miles away from campus)
- FREE meal entitlement
- FREE equipment and trips
- FREE childcare support

If you fall into one of the following categories, you will be eligible to apply for support from the 19+ Bursary:

- Joint Household or household with dependants - income less than £32,300
- Single Household – an income of between £7,800 - £21,530

Please note, if your fees are not funded via the Adult Education Budget or Advanced Learner Loan, you are not eligible to apply.

HELP WITH COURSE FEES

Depending on your circumstances you may be eligible for free or discounted study. Within the course section of this guide, course costs are outlined in the fee columns, split by category (where applicable).

FEES CATEGORIES EXPLAINED

Category A

- In receipt of Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA).
- In receipt of Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) and are in the work-related activity group (WRAG).
- In receipt of Universal Credit (UC), and your take-home pay as recorded on your UC statement (disregarding UC payments and other benefits) is less than £617 a month (you are the sole adult in your benefit claim) or £988 a month (you have a joint benefit claim with your partner) and are determined by Jobcentre Plus (JCP) as being in one of the following groups:
 - All Work Related Requirements Group
 - Work Preparation Group
 - Work Focused Interview Group.
- In receipt of other state benefits (not included in the list above) and your take-home pay (disregarding UC payments and other benefits) is less than £617 a month (you are the sole adult in your benefit claim) or £988 a month (you have a joint benefit claim with your partner) and want to be employed and are undertaking learning that is directly relevant to your employment prospects and the local labour market needs.
- Earn an annual gross salary of less than £21,225 (North of Tyne) and £20,319 (non North of Tyne), aged 19-23 and planning to study towards your first full Level 2 or first full Level 3.
- Aged 19-23 and planning to study towards your first full Level 2 or first full Level 3.

Category B

- Employed and earning between £21,225 and £23,000 (North of Tyne) or between £20,319 and £23,000 (non North of Tyne), planning to study up to and including Level 2. This will show the contribution to be paid towards the course.

Category C

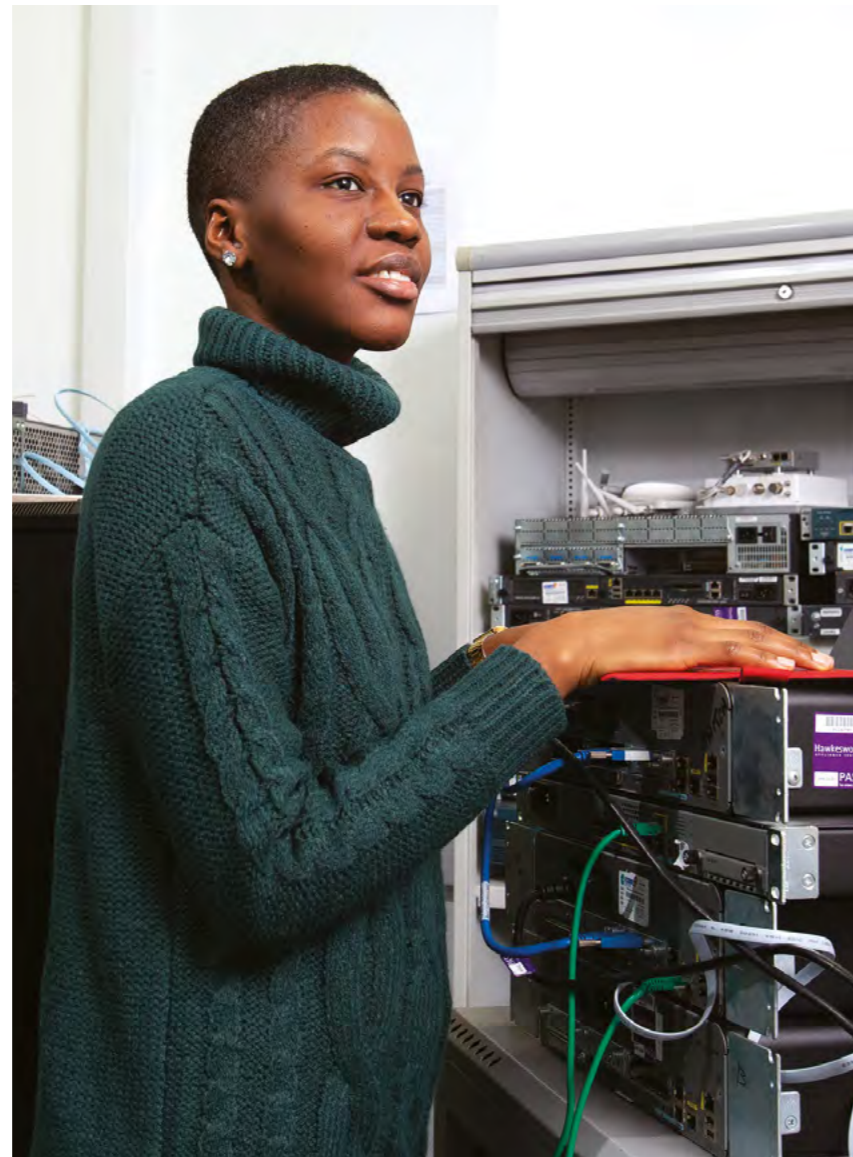
- If none of the above apply this category will show the full cost fee for the course.

Advanced Learner Loan

A loan scheme is available from the government to help learners aged 19+ studying Level 3 to Level 6 further education or professional qualifications (excluding degrees). The amount you will receive depends on the type of course you study and the course fees. To apply and for more information visit **www.gov.uk/advanced-learner-loan** Within this guide the Adult Learner Loan fee is the amount you will need to take an Adult Learner Loan out for to cover the cost of the course.

COURSES TO HELP YOU GET A JOB

EMPLOYABILITY

At Newcastle College we offer a number of courses to help you search for employment opportunities, assist you in developing a CV from scratch or update your existing one as well as how to complete an application form. We can also help prepare you for interviews. These courses are delivered at either Riverside Dene Campus at Cruddas Park or at Denton Burn Library and at other community venues across Newcastle. You may also benefit from completing one of our Digital Skills course to help you with online applications and to assist you in your new job.

SECTOR WORK ACADEMY PROGRAMMES (SWAPS)

SWAPs help prepare those receiving unemployment benefits to apply for jobs in a different area of work. A Sector-Based Work Academy can last up to six weeks and has three main components:

- Pre-employment training – matched to the needs of the business sector
- Work experience placement – a great opportunity to identify talent and for you to gain knowledge and understanding of the required role
- A guaranteed job interview or help with an employer's recruitment process.

SWAPs vary throughout the year depending on job vacancies and employer needs. Current SWAPs available include:

NHS Academy: A five week course working towards an interview for the role of Healthcare Assistant at Newcastle RVI Hospital. Applicants will need to hold a Level 1 in maths and English GCSE/Functional skills, and employment experience in a supportive role.

Nurtured Care: A six week course working towards an interview with Nurtured Health & Homecare, for various roles within the care sector, supporting those with diverse needs to maintain their independence.

City and County Healthcare Group: A six week course working towards an interview with City and County Healthcare Group, for various roles within the care sector, supporting those with a range of disabilities to retain their independence in the home setting of their choice.

Skills Bootcamps are free to anyone aged 19+ years and are flexible courses of up to 16 weeks, giving people the opportunity to build up sector-specific skills and an offer of an interview with an employer upon completion.

RENEWABLE AND SUBSEA ENGINEERING

Skills Bootcamp in Welding Skills - Level 3

Overview

During this practical Skills Bootcamp you will develop core skills and complete welder approval under the coded welding scheme. This will ensure you meet expectations set out by industry partners making you work-ready for the volume of welding job vacancies in the region. You will cover recognised industry requirements and gain recognised qualifications including coded weld test, health and safety, flux core welding, first aid and working at heights.

HOSPITALITY

Skills Bootcamp in Hospitality and Catering Principles: Chef - Level 3

Overview

This practical-based Skills Bootcamp will prepare you for a role within the hospitality industry and present you with recognised vendor qualifications, making you job-ready to move directly into one of the many chef job vacancies currently advertised in the region. You will gain exposure to a range of key industry representatives through guest speaker and visit employment locations. You will develop knowledge skills and behaviours through the completion of topics such as health, safety and first aid, food safety and allergens, food preparation, cooking and finishing of meat, poultry, fish and hot/cold sauces.

Open to anyone aged 19+ either unemployed, looking to work in the hospitality sector or already employed looking to retrain into a skilled profession.

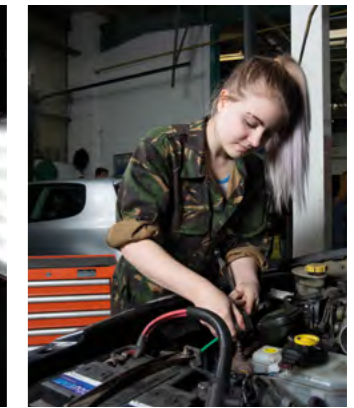

Skills Bootcamp in An Introduction to Technical Skills for Live Events – Level 3

Overview

This Skills Bootcamp is aimed at anyone looking to pursue a career as part of a technical team in the live theatre or part of a production crew at live gigs and festivals. This Skills Bootcamp has been designed and validated by industry experts and supported by Generator NE, Northern Stage and many more North East based employers. You will learn skills including setting up for live sound, supporting lighting designers, becoming part of a staging crew or accompanying set designers. This is your chance to take the first step into the live sound and technical theatre industry and train with like-minded students under industry-experienced tutors. This Skills Bootcamp also offers students placement opportunities within theatres and venues across Newcastle, taking the skills from the classroom and putting them into practice in real-working environments, supervised by experts in the field.

Entry Requirements

Anyone aged 19+ with either 4 GCSEs at Grade 4-5 or equivalent or life experiences that support working at Level 3 qualification standard. We also welcome graduates who are looking to reskill or students who have previously been in education in a similar subject and may be looking to refresh their skills.

It has been designed to give an understanding of full electric and hybrid vehicles and will also deliver identification of all the main components and key safety aspects when working with high voltage systems, including advanced knowledge of carrying out safety shut down procedures.

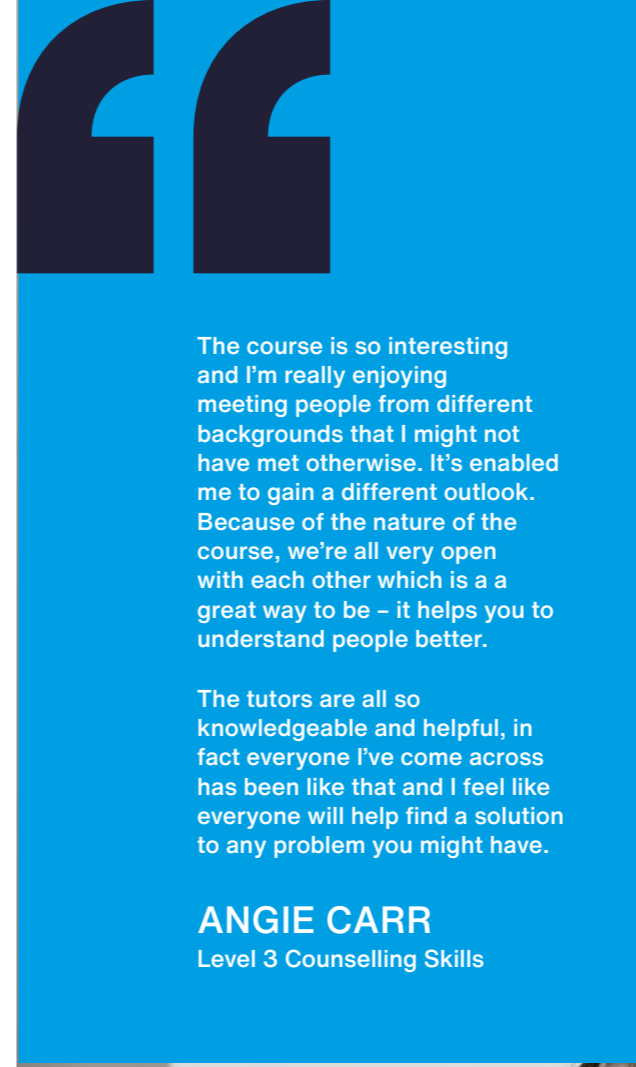
